



Farley Post Office, New York City - c.1914

To All Mobility Advisory Forum Participants:

On Friday morning, April 12, 2013 at 10:00 AM, the Mobility Advisory Forum will hold its next meeting which will consist of a tour of Moynihan Station in New York City. This building is currently the Farley Post Office located directly across the street from Pennsylvania Station. At present Pennsylvania Station is at capacity as it strives to serve Amtrak, Long Island Rail Road, and New Jersey Transit. The Moynihan Station Project will redevelop the McKim, Mead and White designed and landmarked James A. Farley Post Office Building into the new Manhattan home for Amtrak, transforming a treasured building into an iconic railroad passenger station and mixed-use development befitting New York City.

The project is advancing in phases, and the first phase is now under construction. This is a very unique opportunity to see and appreciate the size, scope and complexity of this project as it is converted into New York City's intercity rail gateway.

The opening presentation and tour will begin at 10:00 AM, Friday, April 12, 2013. The Farley Post Office Building is across 8th Avenue from Pennsylvania Station. We will meet inside the main lobby of the post office fronting on 8th Avenue, at the north end near the 33rd Street corner. Please note that this building was opened in 1914 and is not ADA accessible compliant. Also, we will be walking through this very large structure, please wear comfortable shoes.
